Meet the Volunteers

My name is Justyn B. and I'm an alcoholic.

As of March 21, I have been sober for nine years. In my first couple of years in sobriety it was suggested that get into service, first by making coffee, and later, by taking the literature position for my home group. When taking on a literature position, I recalled how much the literature from AA had helped me. In the first days of my sobriety a woman loaned me her copy of the Big Book, and gave me the pamphlets "A Newcomer Asks," "44 Questions" (now "Frequently asked Questions about AA"), and "Questions and Answers on Sponsorship." In my experience, they helped me a lot, giving me the courage to continue, even when I did not understand it all. So I took on the group level literature commitment. At that time, the Central Office was located in Menands, and I recall racing to get to the office before it closed to pick up copies of the Big Book and Living Sober for my home group. I was always greeted by a volunteer with a smile on his or her face, and I was often surprised to find that it was



someone I already knew. On occasion the phone would ring and the volunteer would say "excuse me" and help a caller looking for a meeting. Each time I went there I became more grateful than when I arrived because I was reminded that I was never alone.

In 2016 I was asked if I might have any interest in serving in an open position with the Central Office. Soon the office adopted me as the Literature Chairperson, where I now keep track of and order books, pamphlets and service-related materials from A.A. World Services, A.A. Grapevine books, meeting schedules from HMB Area 48, as well as monthly and annual medallions. I respond to e-mails about literature, and deposit proceeds from the literature and medallion sales, which are then used to restock the office with new literature and medallions. In January, the Central Office had its highest volume of literature and medallions sales ever, almost \$4,000! The Central Office has done so well that it is now able on occassion to donate literature back to the districts and groups that it serves.

I am ever grateful to the volunteers who constantly lend me their support by checking in ordered materials, stocking the shelves, letting me know when we are running low on an item, or telling me about a special order that has been requested by a customer. I could not do my part without them. I am even more deeply grateful when I can sit with them, and we share a few moments as fellow recovering alcoholics. I am constantly amazed as they share their experience strength and hope with me. They remind me of the following passage in the Big Book:



"There is no more aloneness, with that awful ache, so deep in the heart of every alcoholic that nothing, before, could ever reach it. That ache is gone and never need return again. Now there is a sense of belonging, of being wanted and needed and loved. In return for a bottle and a hangover, we have been given the Keys of the Kingdom" (Alcoholics Anonymous, p. 276).

The Capital District Central Office Mission:

An AA Service Organization to Help the Suffering Alcoholic

An AA "Intergroup Office" or "Central Office" is, as the name suggests, traditionally an office (a physical site), centrally located, supported, and staffed by members of AA groups within a specific geographic area.

The geographic area covered by the Capital District Central Office "CDCO" includes Albany, Troy/Cohoes, Schenectady plus Columbia and Rensselaer Counties.

Just as an AA group is a partnership of individuals, a Central Office is a partnership of AA groups. Its primary purpose is that of the fellowship at large - to carry the AA message to the still suffering alcoholic and its primary rationale is that the message can be more effectively and consistently delivered when the member groups share their experience, strength and hope in delivering the message.

It is important to note that the Capital District Central Office is a service organization available to all groups in the Capital District, whether they contribute to its support or not.

The main functions of the Capital District Central Office are to:

- Operate a 24-hour "Hotline" answering service directing callers to local meetings, arranging AA member contacts for newcomers, and otherwise extending the hand of AA to all who reach out for help
- Maintain a centrally located business office
- Compile, display and distribute A.A. literature and information about AA events and activities
- Perform all other functions which serve our primary purpose, as may be directed by the AA groups
- Publish an AA Newsletter



Service Positions Available at the Central Office:

Archivist

Office Volunteers needed! The Office Volunteers are AA members who answer the phone live and greet and provide services to visitors to the Office during hours it is open. A minimum of one year of continuous sobriety is suggested for this position.

Night Owl Volunteers needed! The Night Owls are AA volunteers who take phone calls at home that are forwarded from the Central Office phone during the hours the Office is closed. A minimum of one year of continuous sobriety is suggested for this position.



Capital District Central Office E-Z Riders List The CDCO routinely gets calls from people visiting from out of town. They may be unfamiliar with the area and are looking for rides to local meetings. We also get calls from people new to A.A. who are in the same boat. A.A. members who want to help carry their group's message of recovery are encouraged to sign up as E-Z Riders. By bringing visitors or new folks to your meeting, you will be helping them, your group, and yourself - it's a Win Win! Please let us know your name, phone number and home group (or other groups you're willing to give a ride to) and we will put it on our list.




STRUCTURE OF THE CONFERENCE (U.S. and Canada)
